It now needs updating with equipment possibly in need of replacement and the grounds improved. There is a desire to explore:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ☑Ground improvements within the site to reduce flooding (particularly below the swings). ☑Replacement play equipment. ☑Replacement planking ☑General improvements <p>The work will be done by, and in consultation with, the Council's Park Department.</p>	£30,000.00

Horfield	Community Hub Entrance Improvement Project	Ebetrust (operating as Ebenezer Church)	Our entrance doors, being made of solid wood, prevent people in the local community, who are passing by the property, from being able to easily see into the building, thereby causing an unwanted and unintended barrier to access. The doors are also not secure, 'stick' in wet weather, are draughty in windy weather and not wide enough to facilitate easy disabled access. We plan to replace the wooden doors with aluminum commercial French doors. The main door will be wide enough to facilitate disabled/wheelchair/mobility scooter access. The doors will be glazed in clear glass, enabling passers by to be able to see into the premises. We will also improve the security locks and threshold.	£7,500.00

Horfield	Traffic calming measures for Bishopthorpe Road	Cllr Tom Renhard	Bishopthorpe Road runs through the middle of Manor Farm estate, often used as a cut through to get to Southmead Hospital. Concerns have been raised by local residents about speeding and children also cross the street here to get to nearby Horfield C of E school. It would also make it safer to access the newly opened St Peter's Community Centre. Local residents have called for traffic calming measures to be introduced to address the issues. In particular, a safer crossing point has been requested that is nearer to the Bishopthorpe Road shops / community centre.	
Horfield	Traffic calming measures for Dorian Road	Cllr Tom Renhard	Dorian Road leads to Southmead Hospital at one end. Concerns have been raised by local residents about speeding and children also cross the street here to get to nearby Horfield C of E school. Local residents have called for traffic calming measures to be introduced to address the issues. Particularly, the bend towards the bottom is highlighted as a concern (near Tilling Road), noting there would be a benefit to installing a crossing point.	
Horfield	Improving cycling infrastructure by Horfield Common and Filton Road	Cllr Tom Renhard	Residents have raised safety issues for cyclists along the top of Gloucester Road and Filton Road, with requests made to improve cycling infrastructure in the area. Dedicated cycling infrastructure going north from by Wellington Hill pub through to Filton Road.	

Horfield	Traffic calming measures for Monks Park Ave	Cllr Tom Renhard	Monks Park Ave sits adjacent to Southmead Hospital where there are frequent issues with speeding. Local residents have called for traffic calming measures to be introduced to address the issues.	
Horfield	Traffic calming measures for Wessex Ave	Cllr Tom Renhard	Wessex Ave sits on a fairly steep hill, where there are frequent issues with speeding. When heavier vehicles travel down or up the road, it can cause houses to shake. Local residents have called for traffic calming measures to be introduced to address the issues.	
Multiple wards	"Take a Stand" – cycle parking at community venues	Life Cycle	Life Cycle's "Take a Stand" scheme has installed 5,500 secure cycle stands at community venues over the past 25-years, free of charge. We have a waiting list of local venues asking for stands...but no funds to help. CIL funding will install 60 new cycle stands (parking for 120 bikes) at local venues that pro-actively apply to host it. This intervention is community-led by design, countering arguments that new investment in local cycling infrastructure is 'imposed on' residents.	£15,000.00
Southmead	Southmead Community Men's Space storage at Southmead Development Trust	Mike Murch via Team Southmead	There are at the moment 9 men using Southmead Community Men's Space, it's particularly beneficial to those who have lost wives/partners of which there are at least. The Southmead Community Men's Space has mentored boys from the local community, who were involved in the build of planters for 'The Ranch' youth facility. This proposal is for get their own container which they can use to store wood and tools. There is a demand for more facilities aimed at men (particularly of more mature years) that will help their wellbeing.	£3,000.00
Southmead	Pedestrian crossing on Southmead Road	Cllr Kaz Self	Southmead Road between the Lake Road and Wellington Hill West roundabouts often has pedestrians trying to cross, many trying to get to the bus-stops on that part of the road. There is a need for a pedestrian crossing on this road. This proposal has significant local support, based on a survey carried out. A pedestrian crossing is needed on this part of Southmead Road (people are reluctant to walk to other nearby crossings e.g near the Manor House Nursery). In a survey I carried out 92% agreed or strongly agreed this was needed (graphic inserted on last page of this form) To encourage active travel and improve road safety I am proposing this project. To note a person was killed in this vicinity in 2022 - Southmead-road-crash-victim-named-6776101	

Southmead	Play equipment update in Doncaster Road Park	Team Southmead/Inclusion Southmead c/o Cllr Kaz Self	<p>From accessible see-saws and sensory chimes, to inclusive wheelchair-designed play units, step free routes and wide, open paths, Southmead needs spaces that are inclusive to all. Outdoor play remains an essential part of all children and young peoples lives and needs to include not just those that are in relatively good physical and mental health.</p> <p>This proposal seeks funding to improve the play offering at Doncaster Road Park, a park that is serves one of the most deprived neighbourhoods in Bristol. Help from BCC parks will be needed and appreciated.</p>

Path upgrade would enable access for all to nature.</p> <p>Existing accessible entrance was constructed to the standards at the time using a Lottery Grant, but accessibility needs have changed with e.g. motorised mobility scooters</p>	£59,000.00

They are limited by the number of pitches at Pen Park and the need to rest/rotate the pitches. A pitch laid out in Doncaster Road park will allow them to offer more opportunities for youth participation, including girls and minoritised groups.
