Bishopsworth	Improvements to Kings Head Lane Park	Friends of Kings Head Lane Park	Fix gate to park/put bollards in. Pain play park. Repair roof of brick storage hut (to be used for 'Friends of' group and football club. Paint murals on side walls of hut to celebrate both community groups.	
Bishopsworth	Uplands counter-commuter parking grassland protection scheme	Cllr Richard Edy	Commuters and Bristol Airport Passengers park on grass-verges, damaging the environment and inconveniencing local residents for long periods of time.	
Bishopsworth	Spartley Walk additional parking scheme	Cllr Richard Eddy	Small, quiet 1950's-built Council cul-de-sac has demand for householders' vehicles greatly in excess of present provision and existing green is used for grass parking, causing environmental damage. BCC used to use Narrow Estates Road Budget to fund similar schemes. Use unused green at back of cul-de-sac to provide extra car-parking for residents	
Hartcliffe & Withywood	Improving access and facilities facilities at Withywood Park	Bristol and Bath Parks Foundation	Improvements to Withywood Park including: Accessible gateways, Dropped kerbs, Accessible signage, Single benches with hard-standing, Wheelchair-accessible picnic benches. New sensory trail with planting. Accessible play equipment. Inclusive outdoor equipment for Muga skateboard area	£55,265.67
Hartcliffe & Withywood	Safe crossing for pedestrians and cyclists on Whitchurch Lane, outside Willmott Park	Friends of Willmott Park	Often speeding and dangerous driving affects safety of people using this main walking and/or cycling path from the ward to and from Imperial shopping park and the new youth zone 224 in Filwood. Limited visibility due to road layout and road is often busy as used as alterantive to Hengrove Way.	

Hartcliffe & Witherwood	Maynard Rd through traffic reduction	Neighbourhood Watch- Pigeon House Stream	Maynard Rd is used as rat run due to Fulford Rd. being not fit for purpose although it is a principal residential road. Huge amounts of vehicles using Maynard Rd instead of Fulford Rd to get to Hawkfield Rd. Many examples of racing, over 60mph recorded – on a 20mph road.	
Hengrove & Whitchurch Park	St Bernadette's Schools: Pedestrian Safety & Traffic Calming (New Fosseway Road)	St Bernadette Primary School	We are addressing a critical safety risk on New Fosseway Road (between the school and Gladstone Road). This is a primary route for both St Bernadette Primary and Secondary students, yet it currently lacks any formal, safe crossing point. Frequent near misses, high traffic volumes, and speeding are exacerbated by hazardous 'school run' parking. The new 'The Fosseway' development will further increase vehicle movements, creating a severe conflict between cars and children. Without intervention, this road remains a major barrier to safe, active travel for hundreds of students and local residents. Installation of a raised zebra crossing at a strategic point near the school to provide a safe, designated crossing point and naturally reduce vehicle speeds. This will be supported by physical traffic calming measures and clear signage to improve driver awareness and deter hazardous parking on restricted yellow lines. The goal is to create a 'School Street' environment that prioritises child safety and encourages active travel for the growing local population.	£55,000.00
Hengrove & Whitchurch Park	Development of essential structures for collective food growing space	Lush Greens Bristol CIC	Develop critical infrastructure for a community/collective food growing space, including a kitchen for volunteer lunches, volunteer shelter, disabled access compost loo, packing shed, and tool shed. Structures will be single storey, timber frame and made by collaborators WeCanMake, on minimal foundations, built from sustainable materials designed for accessibility	£34,500.00
Hengrove & Whitchurch Park	Jessop Hub	Jessop Park Residence Association	Create a community hub- a small space made from 3 shipping containers. The infrastructure costs is to set this up so both communities can engage in a network space, interacting on monthly cinema, BBQs, private and public arts, yoga, spoken word etc.	£75,000.00
