**Proposed variation to premises licence:**

An application to remove the existing Annex 2 conditions which are:

1. Ongoing risk assessments shall be carried out in order to comply with Health and Safety legislation.
2. Children as defined by the Act shall vacate the Bar by 21.00 hrs unless such children are eating meals in which case they shall be required to vacate the Bar by 21.30 hrs.

3. Children as defined by the Act shall be accompanied by an adult who shall be required to maintain constant supervision of them.

4. The premises shall not be used for adult entertainment or services, activities, other entertainment or matters ancillary to the use of the premises that may give rise to concern in respect of children, which uses include, among things, nudity or semi-nudity films for restricted age grounds and the presence of gambling machines.

5. Existing company procedures to be applied to the premises in relation to the additional hours granted. Information in respect of the company procedures and policies to be found in "J D Wetherspoon - Overview of Operations" and "J D Wetherspoon - Approach to Responsible Drinks Retailing".

6. Embedded condition - Licensing Act 1964 [section 59, 60, 63, 67A, 68, 70, 74, 76] Intoxicating Liquor shall not be sold or supplied except during permitted hours. In this condition, permitted hours means those standard timings listed on page 1 of this licence, as varied by the non standard timings.

The above restrictions do not prohibit:

On New Years Eve the sale or supply of intoxicating liquor from the beginning of permitted hours on New Years Eve to the end of permitted hours on the following day.

The above restrictions do not prohibit:

(a) the sale or supply to, or consumption by, any person of intoxicating liquor, who is residing in the premises;

(b) the ordering of Intoxicating Liquor to be consumed off the premises, or the despatch by the vendor of the Intoxicating Liquor so ordered;

(c) the sale of Intoxicating Liquor to a trader or club for the purposes of the trade or club;

(d) the sale or supply of Intoxicating Liquor to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the sale or supply of Intoxicating Liquor is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of Her Majesty's naval, military or air forces;

(e) the taking of Intoxicating Liquor from the premises by a person residing there; or

(f) the supply of Intoxicating Liquor for consumption on the premises to any private friends of a person residing there who are bona fide entertained by him at his own expense, or the consumption of Intoxicating Liquor by persons so supplied; or

(g) the supply of Intoxicating Liquor for consumption on the premises to persons employed there for the purposes of the business carried on by the holder of the licence, or the consumption of liquor so supplied, if the liquor is supplied at the expense of their employer or of the person carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.

7. The condition reproduces the effect of The Children and Young Persons Act 1933 (paragraph 6(8) of Schedule 8 Licensing Act 2003 and paragraph 4 of the Licensing Act 2003 Transitional Provisions Order 2005 SI 2005/40. Notwithstanding that by virtue of the Licensing Act 2003 certain provisions of the Children and Young Persons Act 1933 have ceased to have effect in England and Wales, in so far as any provision of that Act (as amended and as in force at 23 November 2005) would restrict the use of the herein licensed premises for 'any existing licensable activities' (within the meaning of Part 1 of Schedule 8 Licensing Act 2003) the said restrictions shall be deemed to continue and it is a condition of this licence that they be duly observed in respect of the use of the premises for any or all such existing licensable activities.

#### 8. Door Supervisors

Unless otherwise agreed with Avon and Somerset Constabulary (and recorded in writing) there shall be a minimum of 2 door supervisors, who have been accredited by the Security Industry Authority, on duty from 2000 hours on Fridays and Saturdays, and who shall remain on duty until the premises closes.

#### 9. Entry and Re-entry

There shall be no new entry to the premises after 00.00 hours on Fridays and Saturdays.

and replace with the following conditions:

1. The premises licence holder shall ensure that a clearly visible notice will be placed on the premises advising those attending, that the Police will be informed if anyone is found in possession of controlled substances or weapons.

2. Clear notices displayed at all points where customers leave the building must instruct them to respect the needs of local residents and leave the premises and the area quietly.

3. Drugs and weapons seized will be placed in a locked receptacle set aside for this purpose. The means for securing or unlocking the receptacle will be retained by the premises licence holder or the designated premises supervisor or in their absence any other responsible person. A record shall be made of the seizure, the time, date and by whom, and to whom the items were handed on to in a bound book specifically kept for that purpose. Such a book to be produced to an authorised officer of the Licensing Authority or a constable upon request. The premises licence holder shall make suitable arrangements with the Police for the collection of any seized items.

4. All staff to be trained in the prevention of underage sales to a level commensurate with their duties. All such training to be updated as necessary, for instance when legislation changes, and should include training on how to deal with difficult customers. The training should be clearly documented and signed and dated by both the trainer and the member of staff receiving it. The documentation shall be available for inspection on request by an authorised officer of the Licensing Authority or a constable.

5. (a) An approved proof of age scheme shall be adopted, implemented and advertised within the premise such as "Challenge 21/25" whereby an accepted form of photographic identification shall be requested before any alcohol is sold to any person who appears to be under 25 years of age. Suitable means of identification would include PASS approved proof of age card, photo-card driving licence and passport. There are no further changes to the Premises Licence.
