



Bristol Local Area Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND)

Written Statement of Action Update – August 2020

Background

- Ofsted and the Care Quality Commission (CQC) carried out a joint inspection of Bristol Local Area between the 30th of September and 4th October 2019
- Bristol's <u>inspection letter</u> identified 5 'significant concerns' and required us to produce a 'Written Statement of Action' (WSoA) that explains how the areas of weakness will be addressed
- The WSoA and letter of confirmation from Ofsted are published on our website
- We have set up a <u>page on the Local Offer</u> to keep parents and carers updated about the inspection and our progress in tackling the areas for improvement
- Bristol will have a full re-visit about 18 months after the inspection to see how effectively we have addressed the serious weaknesses
- Our WSoA sets out what we are aiming to have achieved at the end of each four month period over that timeframe
- The end of each of these periods is described as a 'milestone'
- The first of these milestones was July 2020

Our progress against July 2020 milestones

Introduction

- 75% of the (50 plus) actions set out in the WSoA were achieved by July
- 13% were partially implemented but had changed focus due to the need to respond to Covid-19, or were on track to be achieved by the end of term
- 12% have been delayed or paused due to Covid-19

Priority 1 - Accountability

Governance

•SEND Partnership Group and SEND Improvement Board set up

Performance / data

- Reliable data available via data dashboard
- EHC plan performance monitored and used operationally. Scrutinised at boards and by elected members
- Research project to understand BAME SEND data underway

Roles and responsibilities

- SENDCO conference keynote speaker
- Weekly bulletins to schools and regular meetings with Director of Education and Skills, Alison Hurley

Decision making

Top-up funding review underway

Joint-commissioning plan

- Covid-19 delayed work with health on joint-commissioning plan.
- Partners meeting in July to agree priorities

Co-produce experience measures

- Paused due to Covid-19
- Bristol Parent Carer Forum chair stepped down

Training for education settings

- SENCO briefings and work with school clusters
- Comprehensive SEND training programme developed for Early Years and schools

 More schools are using the Bristol Support Plan

Shared outcomes

 Local Area shared outcomes framework launched and training underway

Health training offers

 Education workforce paused due to Covid-19. Looking at virtual model of delivery.

SEMH

- •Covid-19 delayed work.
- Work has now started. Education Psychology Service working with Child and Adolescent Mental Health Service (CAMHS)

'First call' service

 Refocused to support families of children with EHC plans during Covid-19

Two year old Health Visitor reviews

 Healthy Child Programme paused due to Covid-19

Community paediatrics transformation

Paused due to Covid-19

Priority 3 – EHC plans

SEND team capacity

- Recruited 24 additional staff going through training programme
- Restructured team to develop dedicated Assessment Team
- Robust supervision and performance management
- Standard operating procedures written to create consistent practices

Quality assurance

- Framework agreed and EHC plan audits started. Other QA tools being developed
- Data evidencing volume of EHC plans finalised and timeliness increased

EHC plan processes

- 'Time for Change' project working with parent carers to redesign and improve EHC plan template and statutory processes
- Standard letters for parents rewritten
- Joint operational guidance written and shared
- Single template developed for health professionals to contribute to EHC plans
- Additional Educational Psychologists to speed up reports

Sustainable model for health contributions

•Delayed due to Covid-19

Priority 4 – Inclusion

Specialist Provision

 Schools helped identify additional specialist places for September

School Improvement Offer

- Reviewed the way Bristol supports school improvement to enhance offer including SEN
- Working group led by Bristol Early Years Teaching School and Teaching
 Learning Consultants for reading
- Draft of the 'Ordinarily Available Provision' for pupils with SEND written and out for consultation.

Transitions

- Early years to school: working group established and research into issues underway
- post-16: 14-25 service established aligned with preparation for adulthood

Attendance and Exclusion

- Task group established and meeting - Inclusion is critical to Belonging Strategy and Covid-19 recovery plan.
- Transition document written as guidance for schools when pupils return to school in September

Autism

 Work to improve transition from children's to adult services on hold due to Covid-19

Priority 5 – Relationship with Parents

Parent Carer Survey

- Parent Carer and young people survey undertaken. 370 parents and 60 young people took part.
- Findings shared to inform QA work and SEND team improvements.
- Full analysis and report published on Local Offer

Co-produced Local Offer Website Development Plan

- Due to Covid-19, unable to engage parent carers fully to make an informed decision for the development, so current focus is on promoting the Local Offer website.
- Revised plan to engage the whole community in the Local Offer website through promotion

Co-production Charter and training of Local Area leaders

- Workshop arranged for March cancelled due to Covid-19
- Development work stalled due to Bristol Parent Carer Forum chair stepping down.
- Interim BPCF chair secured 1 day per week from 1st May and planning strategic co-production developments
