EYR05 - Disability Access Fund

Information for parents, carers and Early Years providers

The Disability Access Fund (DAF) is funding that enables early years providers to support children claiming funded hours who are in receipt of Disability Living Allowance (DLA). It funds providers to make reasonable adjustments to their settings to further support children with disabilities or special needs. This is so that they can make the most of the opportunity which early education offers them.

Children are eligible for the DAF if they meet both of the following criteria:

- the child's parent/carer receives Disability Living Allowance for the child;
- the child is accessing their free early education entitlement

Providers will be entitled to receive a one-off payment of £910 per year to make appropriate adjustments at their setting. The DAF is not based on an hourly rate; it is an additional entitlement and is for use at one setting. If the child attends more than one setting, the parents will need to choose which of their providers gets the funding. The funding cannot be transferred between early years settings, and it will not move with the child if the child moves settings.

Children do not have to take up their full funded hours to receive the DAF. It is up to the childcare provider to decide how they spend the DAF, but it cannot be used to pay for additional hours. Support, advice, and guidance is available for providers from the Early Years Portage and Inclusion Team.

Where a child lives in one authority area, but attends a provider in a different local authority, the provider's local authority is responsible for funding the DAF.

Providers are responsible for identifying eligible children and should speak to parents to find out if they are eligible for the DAF. Providers should use the EYR01 Parent Declaration Form, which asks parents for the necessary information for a range of early years funding, including the DAF.

Providers should obtain a copy of the child's Disability Living Allowance (DLA) award letter from eligible parents as proof of their eligibility. This must be stored securely. Providers will need to update the Live Register & upload a copy of the proof documentation to the Provider Portal at the first available headcount.

Providers will receive their payment via their usual funding stream.
