

Data is received from various sources, including:

- **Education data** from X-Vault (attendance data), EYES (case management system) and the DFE School census
- **Housing data** received from the council's housing systems (Civica / Abritas)
- **Police data** received from Avon and Somerset Police (Niche / Anti-Social Behaviour systems)
- **Social care data** received from Bristol City Council's Liquid Logic case management systems
- **Benefits / Unemployment data** received from the Department for Work and Pensions
- **Health data** received from the South Central and West Commissioning Support Unit (GP registrations), substance misuse and mental health

It is ingested and stored within a secure SQL server.

Analysis is carried out on the data, and it is visualised using Microsoft PowerBI.

Using legal obligation as a lawful basis for processing

Co-operation to improve wellbeing

Each local authority in England must make arrangements to promote co-operation between— a) the authority; b) each of the authority's relevant partners; and c) such other persons or bodies as the authority consider appropriate, being persons or bodies of any nature who exercise functions or are engaged in activities in relation to children in the authority's area. (The Children Act 2004)

Information-sharing in relation to welfare services etc

A qualifying person who holds relevant information for a prescribed purpose relating to welfare services, council tax or housing benefit may— a) use the information for another prescribed purpose relating to welfare services, council tax or housing benefit; b) supply it to another qualifying person for use in relation to the same or another prescribed purpose relating to welfare services, council tax or housing benefit. (Welfare Reform Act 2012)
