

Summary of public comments:

Tree planting plan for Gladstone Street Park, Redfield.

A draft tree planting plan was circulated to local residents and displayed in locations on the street. In addition, it was added to the consultation page on the Bristol City Council website.

Thank you to everyone for taking the time to comment. Below is a summary of the comments and enquiries received; Bristol City Council's response; and any revisions to the plan where appropriate.

See below for a summary of comments received and our response:

<p>Concern of impact of trees on the grass growth</p>	<p>The trees are chosen with the right tree, right place, right reason principle. In urban spaces this means selecting the best tree to deliver the most benefit, avoiding underground services and choosing trees that don't outgrow the space available.</p> <p>The trees chosen are all small, light canopy trees which will add local character and interest to the park, whilst not affecting the grass. These will act as the next generation of trees which will replace the existing ash trees.</p>
<p>Is there a maintenance plan in place?</p>	<p>Trees will be watered and checked weekly over the spring/ summer in year one and fortnightly in year two. Once established, the trees will be managed within the Council's tree maintenance programme and Tree Management Policies.</p>
