

Use of Parks Notice Boards

Parks notice boards are to promote relevant information including:

- community events
- volunteering
- other local events and activities
- citywide Bristol Parks or partner organisation events



Who is responsible for promotion in parks notice boards?

- Keyholders are Parks Officers and Friends Group leads
- Those responsible should ensure promotion is removed in a timely manner after the activity

Typical activities that can be promoted are:

- Parks events and activities - large events licensed by BCC Site Permissions team, and smaller community events agreed by Bristol Parks
- Volunteering sessions whether led by BCC staff, Your Park or Friends groups.
- Parks job adverts (some local community jobs or training may also be advertised with Bristol Parks permission).
- Citywide events and activities promoted by Bristol Parks (for example, Festival of Nature)
- Friends group meetings
- Information relating to the use of the park (for example, reminders about park byelaws such as dog fouling)
- Local community events near the park
- Wildlife and nature conservation in and around the park
- Other relevant information (for example, planned works which may affect park users such as tree work, path work, toilet closures)
- Police information
- Other info may be allowed at Parks Officer discretion

Parks notice boards are not to be used to promote the following:

- Political promotion, including demonstrations and protests
- Anything that could incite hate crime or violence or be considered offensive.
- Information irrelevant to the park (for example, lost cat or dog posters)
- Unofficial events and activities not sanctioned by BCC
- Advertising for businesses (unless approved by a parks officer)

Removal of promotion:

- Parks staff reserve the right to remove out of date or inappropriate promotion
- Stickers and posters on the outside of notice boards are not permitted
